He rocks when it comes to making great whites and this one is a blend of grapes from three subregions in Marlborough; Awatere (73%), Waihopai (17%) and Kekerengu (10%). Loads of fruit thinning in the vineyard provided grapes with super-rich concentrated flavours, which were then cool-fermented to make a dry wine with fresh white fruit aromas and a long, soft finish - delicious." "The 2019 vintage was grown principally (60 per cent) in the Awatere Valley, but also in the Wairau Valley and at Kekerengu. Mostly hand-harvested, it is a bright, light lemon/green, full-bodied wine, with good intensity of vibrant, citrusy, peachy, slightly spicy flavours, a touch of complexity, and a lingering, basically dry finish. "The 2018 vintage was grown mostly (74 per cent) in the Awatere Valley, but also in the Wairau Valley and at Kekerengu. Mostly hand-picked, it is fragrant and fresh, with strong pear-like flavours, hints of peaches and spices, and a dry (3 grams/litre of residual sugar) finish. The 2017 vintage (4*), still on sale, is a 50:50 blend of fruit from the Southern Valleys and Awatere Valley. Drinking well now, it has good intensity of vibrant pear and spice flavours, dry (3.9 grams/ litre of residual sugar) and lingering." 2020 Edition
